Sub: (a) Deep Depression over north Gujarat and adjoining southeast Rajasthan

The deep depression over East Rajasthan moved nearly westwards with a speed of 10 kmph during past 6 hours and lay centered at 1730 hours IST of today, the 26th August over north Gujarat and adjoining southeast Rajasthan near latitude 23.8°N and longitude 73.0 °E, about 90 km east-southeast of Deesa (Gujarat), 110 km northeast of Ahmedabad (Gujarat), 180 km northeast of Surendranagar (Gujarat) and 330 km east-northeast of Bhuj (Gujarat).

It is likely to continue to move slowly west-southwestwards across Gujarat region and reach Saurashtra & Kutch and adjoining areas of Pakistan and northeast Arabian Sea by morning of 29th August.

(b) Well Marked Low Pressure Area over Gangetic West Bengal and adjoining Jharkhand

The well marked low pressure area over Gangetic West Bengal moved west-northwestwards and lay over Gangetic West Bengal and adjoining Jharkhand at 1730 hours IST of today, the 26th August 2024. It is likely to move west-northwestwards across Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand and adjoining north Odisha during next 2 days.

Warnings:

(i) Rainfall Warning:

Madhya Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places very likely on 26th August.

Rajasthan: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places and extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places is likely on 26th August. Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places is likely on 27th August.

Gujarat State:

- **(a) Gujarat region:** Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places and isolated extremely heavy rainfall likely on 26th and 27th August and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 28th August.
- **(b) Saurashtra & Kutch:** Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places and extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places is likely on 26th and 27th August; heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places is likely on 28th & 29th August and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 30th August.
- (c) Central parts of Gujarat region and northern districts of Saurashtra: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with extremely heavy to exceptionally heavy rainfall at isolated places is likely over central parts of Gujarat region and northern districts of Saurashtra region on 26th August.

Konkan & Goa: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places is likely on 26th and heavy rainfall on 27th & 28th August.

Madhya Maharashtra: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places is likely on 26th and heavy rainfall at isolated places is likely on 27th & 28th August.

Odisha: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places is likely during 26th to 28th August.

Gangetic West Bengal: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places is likely on 26th August and heavy rainfall at isolated places is likely on 27th August.

Jharkhand: Light to moderate rainfall at many places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places is likely on 26th August and heavy rainfall at isolated places is likely on 27th & 28th August.

Bihar: Light to moderate rainfall at many places with heavy rainfall at isolated places is likely during 26th to 28th August.

(ii) Wind warning:

• Strong surface wind speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph is very likely to prevail over Madhya Pradesh on 26th August.

- Strong surface wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is very likely to prevail over South Rajasthan on 26th and 27th August.
- Strong surface wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is very likely over Gujarat state, along and off Gujarat & adjoining Pakistan and north Maharashtra coasts and northeast Arabian Sea during 26th - 28thAugust.
- Squally wind speed reaching 55-65 kmph gusting to 75 kmph is likely to prevail along & off Gujarat & adjoining Pakistan coasts and northeast and adjoining eastcentral Arabian Sea on 29th and 30th August. Squally wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph would prevail over interior districts of Gujarat state on 29th August.
- Squally wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail along and off north Maharashtra coasts on 28th& 29thAugust.

(iii) Sea condition:

- Squally weather with Rough to very Rough sea conditions is very likely to prevail along & off Gujarat & adjoining Pakistan and north Maharashtra Coasts and Northeast & adjoining Eastcentral Arabian Sea till 30th August.
- Squally weather with Rough Sea condition is very likely to prevail over North Bay of Bengal and along & off North Odisha, West Bengal, Bangladesh coasts on 26th August.

(iv) Fisherman warning:

- Fishermen are advised not venture into Northeast & adjoining Eastcentral Arabian Sea and along & off Gujarat &adjoining Pakistan and north Maharashtra Coasts till 30th August.
- Fishermen are advised not to venture into North Bay of Bengal and along & off North Odisha, West Bengal, Bangladesh coasts on 26th August.

(v) Advisory for offshore/onshore Exploration and Production (E & P) Operators:

The small ships and offshore -onshore E & P operators, shipping and port authorities along & off Gujarat & north Maharashtra Coasts and Northeast & adjoining Eastcentral Arabian Sea are advised to keep watch on developing weather and take necessary actions.

(vi) Impact Expected

- ➤ Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas of the above region.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- > Reduction of visibility over sea area due to sea spray induced by strong wind and heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- > Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- > Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- ➤ Localized Landslides/Mudslides/landslips/mud slips/land sinks/mud sinks.
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- ➤ It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

(v) Action Suggested

- Fishermen are advised not to venture into Northeast & adjoining Eastcentral Arabian Sea and along & off Gujarat &adjoining Pakistan and north Maharashtra Coasts till 30th August.
- Fishermen are advised not to venture into North Bay of Bengal and along & off North Odisha, West Bengal, Bangladesh coasts on 26th August.
- Judicious regulation of offshore/onshore Operations
- Judicious regulation of surface transports including railways and roadways.
- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.
- **(vi) Agromet advisories for Heavy** Rainfall likely over various Madhya Pradesh, South Rajasthan, Gujarat State and North Maharashtra
- ➤ Make provision for draining out excess water from crop fields to avoid water stagnation in Madhya Pradesh, South Rajasthan, Gujarat State and North Maharashtra.
- ➤ Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking to vegetables.





DD: DEEP DEPRESSION (28-33 KT) CS: CYCLONIC STORM (34-47 KT)


SCS: SEVERE CYCLONIC STORM (48-63KT)

VSCS: VERY SEVERE CYCLONIC STORM (64-89 KT)









- Action may be taken based on ORANGE AND RED COLOUR warnings.

District wise Warning Graphics












Flash Flood Guidance



24 hours Outlook for the Flash Flood Risk (FFR) till 1730 IST of 27-08-2024:

High flash flood risk likely over few watersheds & neighbourhoods of following Met Sub-divisions during next 24 hours.

East Rajasthan - Banswara, Dungarpur, Pratapgarh and Udaipur districts. West Madhya Pradesh - Alirajpur, Jhabua, Mandsaur, Nimach and Ratlam districts.


Gujarat Region - Ahmadabad, Anand, Aravalli, Bharuch, Chhota Udepur, Dahod, Gandhinagar, Khera, Mahesana, Mahisagar, Narmada, Panchmahal, Sabar Kantha and Vadodara districts. **Saurashtra & Kutch -** Amreli, Bhavnagar, Botad, Devbhoomi Dwarka, Diu, Gir Somnath, Jamnagar, Junagarh, Porbandar, Rajkot, Surendranagar, Morbi and Kachchh districts.

Konkan & Goa - North Goa, South Goa, Mumbai City, Palghar, Raigarh, Ratnagiri, Sindhudurg, Suburban Mumbai and Thane districts.

Surface runoff/ Inundation may occur at some fully saturated soils & low-lying areas over Area of Concern (AoC) as shown in map due to expected rainfall occurrence in next 24 hours.
